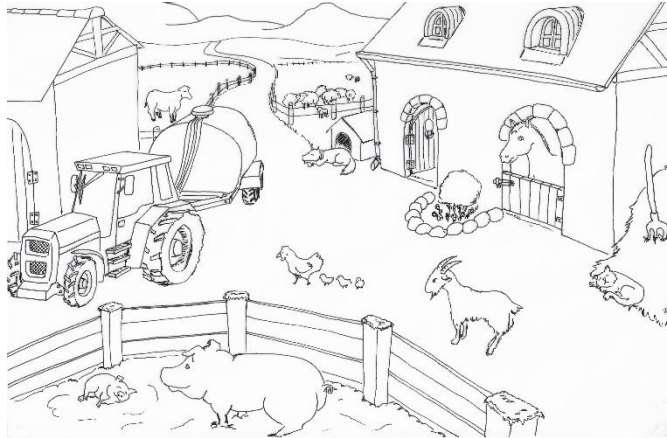

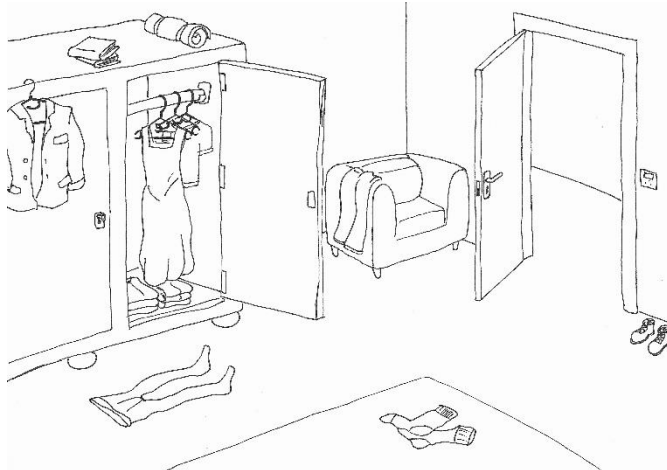
Task

1. Follow the instructions and circle as required.

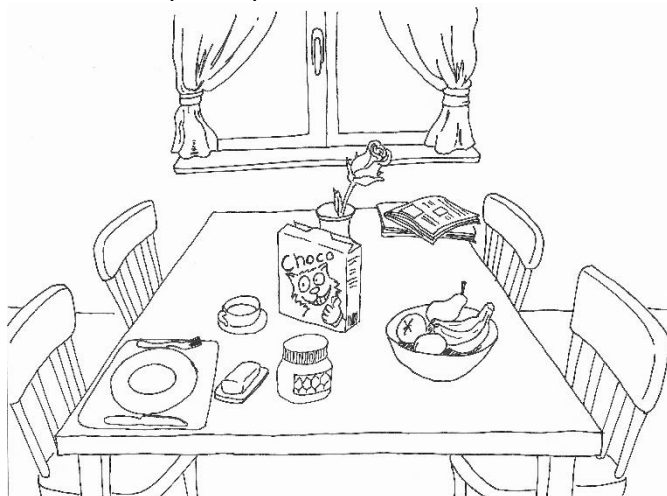
a. Circle the dog, the goat and the horse.



b. Circle the shoes, the socks and the dress.

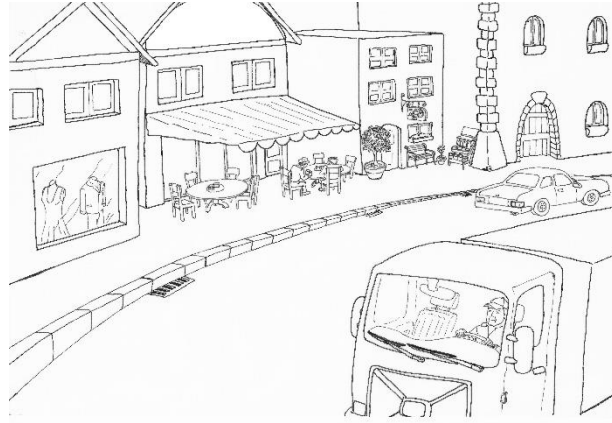


c. Circle the cup, the plate and the knife.

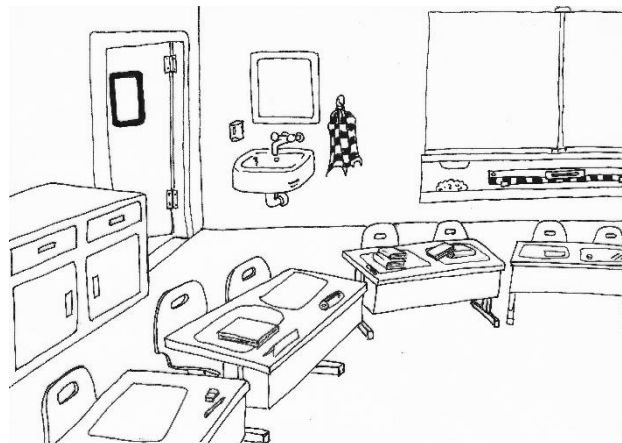


2. Follow the instructions and circle as required.

Last week the boy experienced a big surprise. His uncle put a lobster on his plate. It looked dangerous and had large claws.

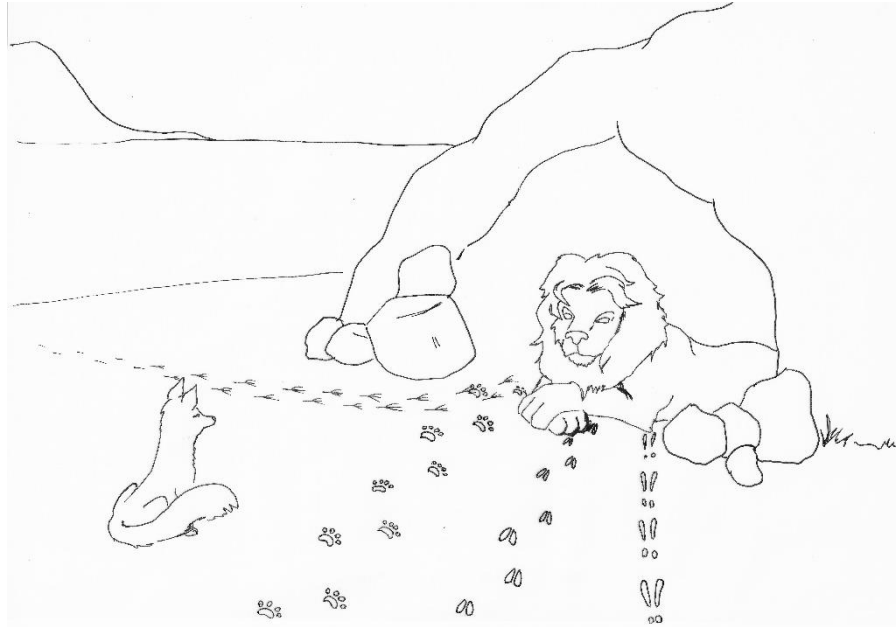
The boy loves to visit his grandmother. She always cooks his favourite food. Yesterday she baked a chocolate cake. He ate a large slice.

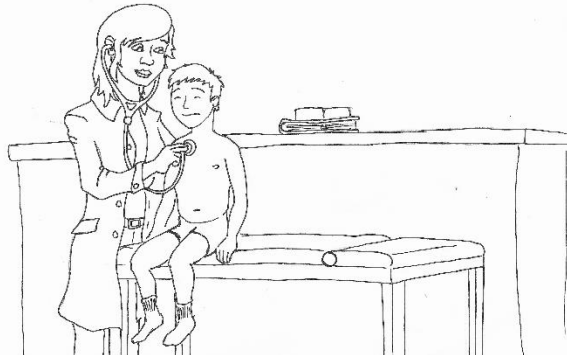
